Govt to procure produce of farmers in hills, auction them at Ooty market

Building to be set up for market complex, vegetables to be auctioned directly to the traders

THE Department of Agricultural Marketing and Agri Business has decided to join hands for the first time with the cooperative societies in Nilgiris to procure vegetables directly from the small and medium farmers in the hills and auction them at the vegetable market complex near Uzhavar Shantahi in Ooty town.

Cooperative Society, said the major produce of small-scale farmers across the district are beans, potatoes, carrots, and beetroots, which will be auctioned directly to the traders at this renovated building.

"Based on District Collector Lakshmi Bhavya Tanneru's instruction, we (Nilgiris Cooperative Marketing Society) are joining hands with the agriculture marketing department for

this initiative. We will also urge the farmers to bring their produce directly to the auction centre. Until now, the cooperative marketing society functioning at Ooty Municipal Market has been only selling Chinese vegetables like cabbage and broccoli," said Dhayalan.

R Suresh Babu, secretary in-charge of the Nilgiris Market Committee, said the works for

the joint venture commenced three months ago and the building renovation work will be completed next month. "We conducted a meeting on Tuesday with the representatives of the Ooty Vegetable Traders Association and Farmers Producers Company and conveyed information about the marketing society's plan. The market complex spread over 25 cents of land can handle around 100 tonnes of vegetables at a time," he added. State's new textile policy will sustain Tiruppur's knitwear industry, says secy

THE state's new textile policy will sustain the existing ecosystem, said Dharmendra Pratap Yadav, the principal secretary of Handlooms, Handicrafts, Textiles and Khadi Department, at Tiruppur on Wednesday. He was inaugurating the 51st India International Knit Fair organised by the India Knit Fair Association (IKFA), Apparel Export Promotion Council (AEP), and Tiruppur Exporters' Association (TEA).

Speaking to media, Yadav said, "The state government is supporting the Tiruppur knitwear industry as much as possible. At present, we are working on a new textile policy catered to industry development. While we will not have a level of competition like other

states, such as improving the industry through more subsidies, we have to sustain our ecosystem. We are now at the top of a value chain and the government will consider necessary aspects to retain and provide appropriate support."

He added that 35% of the to-

tal yarn produced in the country are from spinning mills in the state. "However, there is a need to modernise the spinning sector. In addition, regular subsidies have been planned for other sectors with a focus on technical textiles," he further said.

BC, MBC, DNC and minorities received ₹10.91 crore aid in last 3 yrs

HIGHLIGHTING the various welfare measures, including tailoring machines for women and scholarships for students of Backward Classes (BC), Most Backward Classes (MBC), and minorities across the district, Collector Lakshmi Bhavya

Tanneru said that an assistance worth ₹10.91 crore were given to 13,946 people, in the last three and a half years.

The collector added that CM M K Stalin had created a platform to improve the economic status of these communities and initiated various plans, including employment opportu-

nities on par with other communities. "A total of 776 students of these communities, including Denotified Communities (DNC), between classes 3 and 6 in the district received ₹4.90 lakh worth of scholarships since May 7, 2021. Likewise, 5,644 students studying in class 11 in government and gov-

ernment-aided schools have received free bicycles worth ₹2.78 crore in the past two years," said an official from the Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Department. Adding that the government is also distributing tailoring machines to improve the livelihood of the women,

the official said, "A total of 78 women belonging to BC and MBC communities have received tailoring machines worth ₹4.80 lakh whereas 66 women from other minority communities have received tailoring machines worth ₹3.32 lakh, along with welfare assistance of ₹35.40 lakh."
